This first birthday will be a great family memory, for sure. For me, "souvenir" means "photo"! So I came up with a little photo booth decor for your selfies and other family photos.

Print the small decor on thick paper and cut it following the outline of each shape. The waves can be connected. Just print the sheet several times if you want to create an ocean. Glue the decor on a large sheet of blue paper. Stick the poster to the wall with two pieces of masking tape. This paper adhesive comes off easily without leaving a trace!

Print only pages 3 to 6 to avoid wasting ink and paper.

### Material:

- Blue A2 paper
- Thick white paper
- Scissors
- Glue
- Masking tape












To add to the fun, print off the captain's beard and sailor's beret to use as a photo disguise!



I like the idea of giving a small souvenir after a birthday party.


It is related to the "family photo" activity that I suggest, but can be done individually.

### Material:

- Thick white paper
- Scissors
- Cutter or scalpel
- Instax Mini or printed photo












Print pages 3 and 4 on the two sides of rigid paper.


Fold the cards in two and open the dotted slits with a cutter.


Create a portrait using an instant camera and slide the photo into the card.


The blank page lets you add a personal note!























### **DECO**





For this theme there are many options! You can really take the plunge with this game by inflating rubber rings, hanging a fishing net on the wall or covering the floor of the room with sand!

Happily, I am limiting myself to decorating the table, which I'm sure you will understand. Between the cakes and the snacks, the theme is already well established. So I finally added a few objects so as not to overload my table

I am simply using a blue linen sheet as a tablecloth and I brought a bouquet of seaside grasses to ensure a nice natural presence of their own

The rest of the decor is achieved through the choice of dishes. I followed a blue/red/white colour code, highlighted by a little kraft paper to give the impression of sand and reeds.

















With the help of my graphic designer friend, I can personalise the beakers (or glasses, bottles...) for your table.

Just print them on a paper sticker, cut out the shape and stick on a support.
